We started 2021 cautiously optimistic and we ended the year with much the same vibe! We spent lots of energy dealing with COVID and implementing safety measures, but we also had **one of the most successful years in Chicago Fair Trade history**.

From our partnership with After School Matters to a Holiday Pop-Up Shop that drew the largest number of participating fair trade vendor partners ever, our success in 2021 made us eager to continue advocating for social ethical production in the New Year.



The Three Pillars of CFT: Educate, Activate, Celebrate!

Everything we do as an organization focuses on two things:

- Building individual consumer demand for, and expanding the supply of, fair trade through education and advocacy
- Strengthening and broadening the community that celebrates the value of fair trade

Here are just a few of the ways we did this in 2021:



After School Matters

Chicago Fair Trade has always prioritized youth leaders and by partnering with <u>After School Matters</u>, we engaged teens throughout the city, expanding our reach.

Build Your Brand: Ethical Entrepreneurship and Chicago Fair Trade enrolled over 100 entrepreneurial teens from the city of Chicago who participated in social justice immersion courses while learning about fair trade and the intersection between social impact work and for-profit businesses.



Andersonville Galleria

During our holiday pop up shop, SO many customers ask where they can find our products year round! In 2021 Chicago Fair Trade found the answer: we opened a permanent shop in the Andersonville Galleria, where business members from around the city showcase their items for sale all year round.

Conscious Closet Club

In 2021, the <u>Conscious Closet Club</u> was formed. The CCC is a community of Chicagoans with an interest in ethical clothing and fashion who learn from each other, share ideas, and have fun. Cheers to a year of education, fun events, and looking good in ethical fashion!

Globalfest

We came together at Newberry Library to celebrate our annual Globalfest, honoring member brand <u>WorldFinds</u> and human rights advocate and entrepreneur, <u>Nasreen Sheikh</u>. It was an invigorating night of live music, festive food and drink, and a popular silent auction.



Holiday Pop-Up Shop

Our annual Chicago Fair Trade Holiday Pop-Up Shop was booming from November-December at our new location in Andersonville.

The shop hosted over 25 fair trade vendors and sold 22,229 fair trade items to 6,345 happy customers, totaling \$358,000 worth of fair trade goods. Ending 2021 spreading the message of fair trade to thousands of people was quite an experience!



Rethink Ethical Podcast

Chicago Fair Trade's interns from Whitney Young High School, Lila, Maya, and Vivian, created an educational fair trade podcast called Rethink Ethical. It follows the girls on a mission to learn more about fair trade and other issues of import to the social impact movement.



World Fair Trade Day

We challenged our supporters to Build Back Fairer. Local residents took action in educating, activating, and celebrating fair trade and earned awards to acknowledge their accomplishments. We even hosted a virtual awards ceremony!


